My understanding of my task on Tuesday is to begin the process to expedite the export of the consignment of puppies to Singapore. I have not discussed a more general inspection or reporting of the dogs as a whole with Dominic, and my understanding is that there has not been permission granted for this by the RSPCA.

When I last spoke to Dominic, he explained that the RSPCA was baulking at allowing microchipping of the dogs in general.

Please note that I do not have unlimited time on Tue morning before I am required elsewhere. In addition, I am not attending the RSPCA as your advocate in the dispute between yourself and the RSPCA - rather, I am prepared to perform specific tasks on your behalf provided relevant permissions have been granted by the RSPCA.

It would be wise to supply me with a detailed manifest of the extra animals that you would like chipped in case permission is granted.

Geraldine, I can tell from your e-mails how upset you are with the events that have occurred. However, I feel it is important that if we visit the RSPCA on tuesday, that we confine ourselves only to tasks that have been agreed upon. It is also important to keep remonstrations and emotions in check, lest you jeopardise future access and cooperation from the RSPCA.

I have viewed and read all of the email correspondence forwarded by each of you over the weekend and this morning.

The RSPCA Chief Inspector Michael Pecic has given permission for both of you to attend at the RSPCA's Fairfield kennels at 9am tomorrow 22/01/08 for the purpose of:

- 1) Identifying the puppies for shipping to Benji Kennels, Singapore
- 2) Vaccinating the puppies for shipping to Benji Kennels, as required
- 3) Microchipping those puppies for shipping to Benji Kennels, as required

The RSPCA will then allow another access visit for dipping and final veterinarian inspection / certification by reference to the applicable quarantine requirements and the flight date.

The RSPCA is not prepared to allow microchipping of the 30-40 other dogs which Geraldine considers as her valuable puppies and breeding stock. However, Mr Pecic has assured me that the RSPCA has a unassailable numerical identification system by which each animal can be isolated and identified. The RSPCA is prepared for Geraldine to walk around the kennels, identify each animal and record the unique number assigned to it - but we are told that due to staffing limitations that process cannot occur until later in the week.

Geraldine, you should make arrangements with the RSPCA inspectors tomorrow for a mutually convenient time for you to re-attend later in the week to inspect & record the i.d. numbers of the other dogs. You should also ascertain the shipping company the RSPCA is comfortable with in respect of the Benji Kennels dogs.
